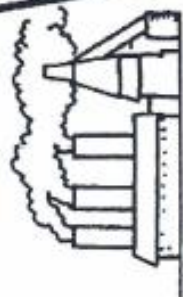

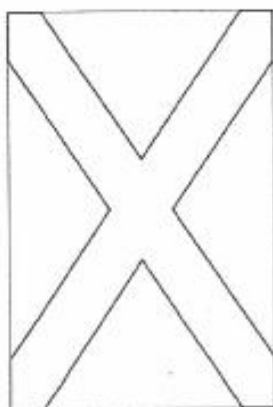

COVER PAGE - Color

PAGE 1 - Color, glue rice on leaves for eggs. Make a fingerprint caterpillar on limb.

PAGE 2 - Color, and make a fingerprint caterpillar.

PAGE 10 - Make a fingerprint caterpillar.

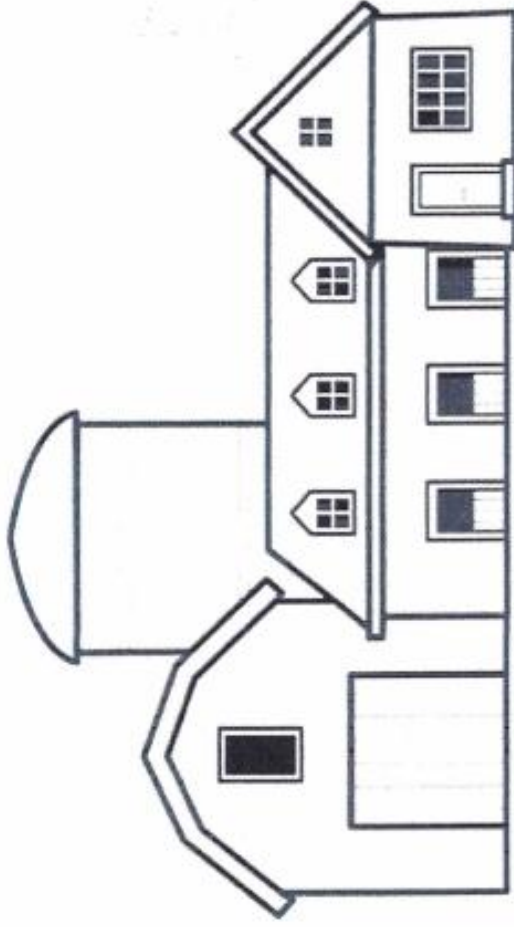
PAGE 11 - Make a fingerprint caterpillar. Glue some hay around bale.

PAGE 12 - Make a big caterpillar by using pom poms and googly eyes.

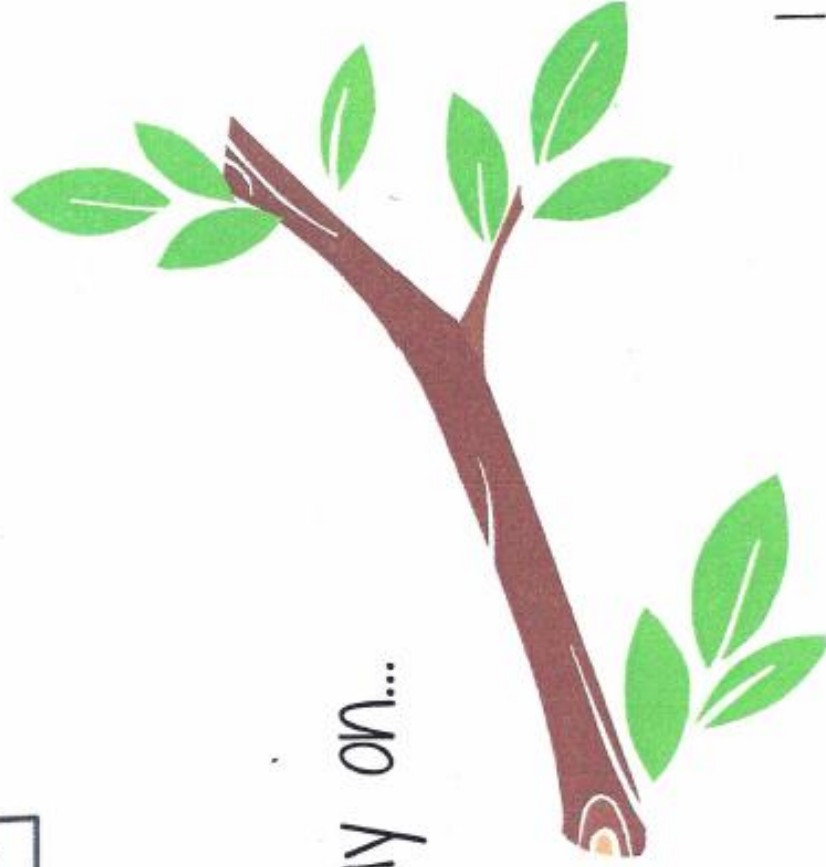
PAGE 13 - Glue shell macaroni on limb for the chrysalis.

PAGE 14 - Create a bag butterfly by cutting up different colored tissue paper and putting them in a snack-size baggie. Seal. Take a black pipe cleaner and wrap it around the center of the baggie and then form to look like antennae. Glue to the page.

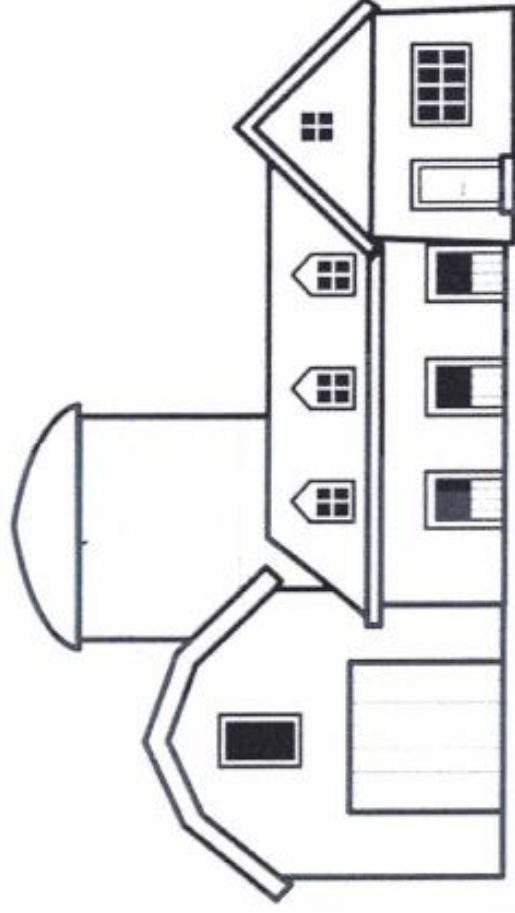
On an Alabama farm,



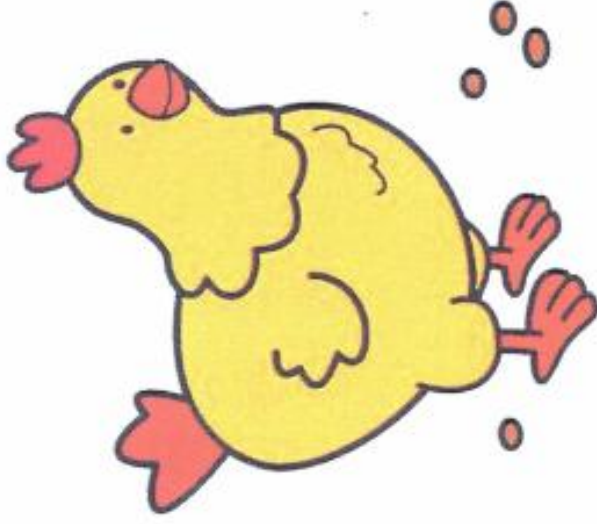
a little Egg lay on...

and very hungry CATERPILLAR.

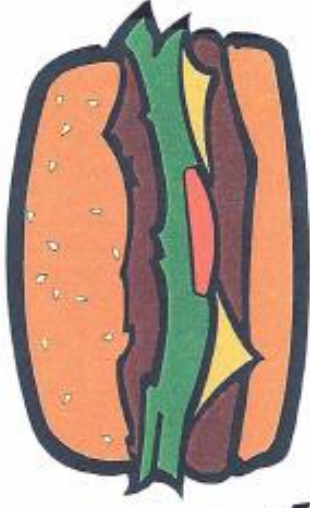
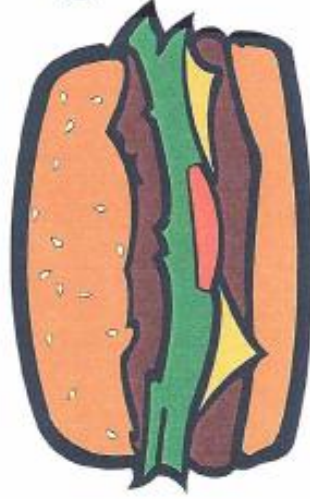


On Monday, he ate ONE CHICKEN FINGER

Dekalb County HAMBURGERS.



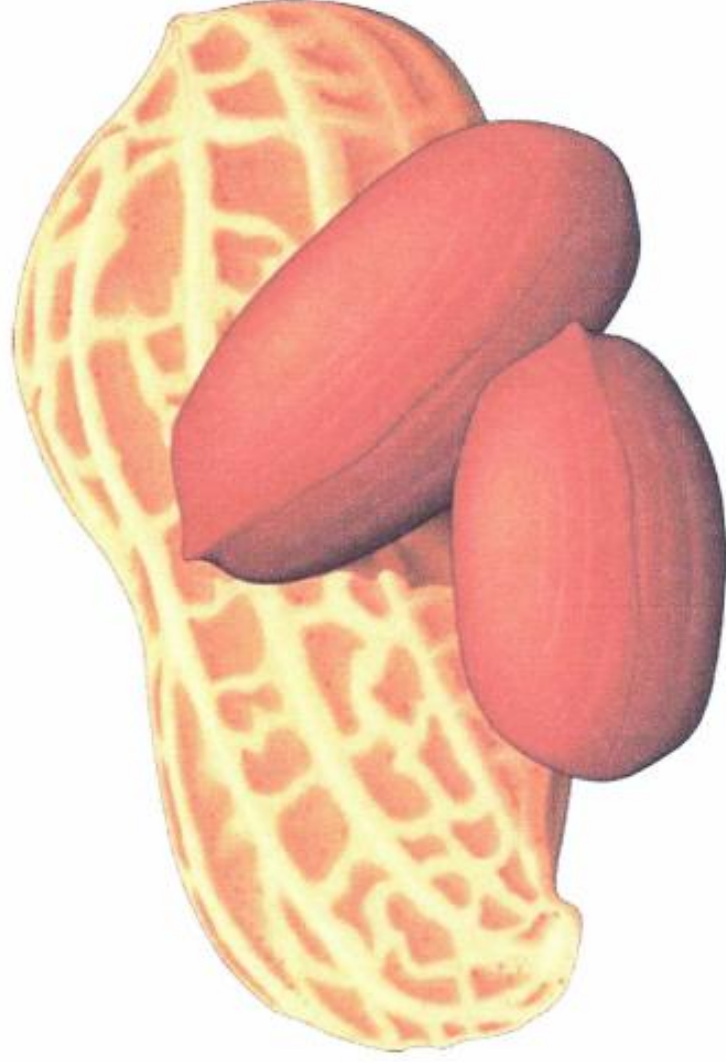
(Cattle/Calves is Alabama's number two cash commodity.)

and Greene Counties. But he was still hungry.





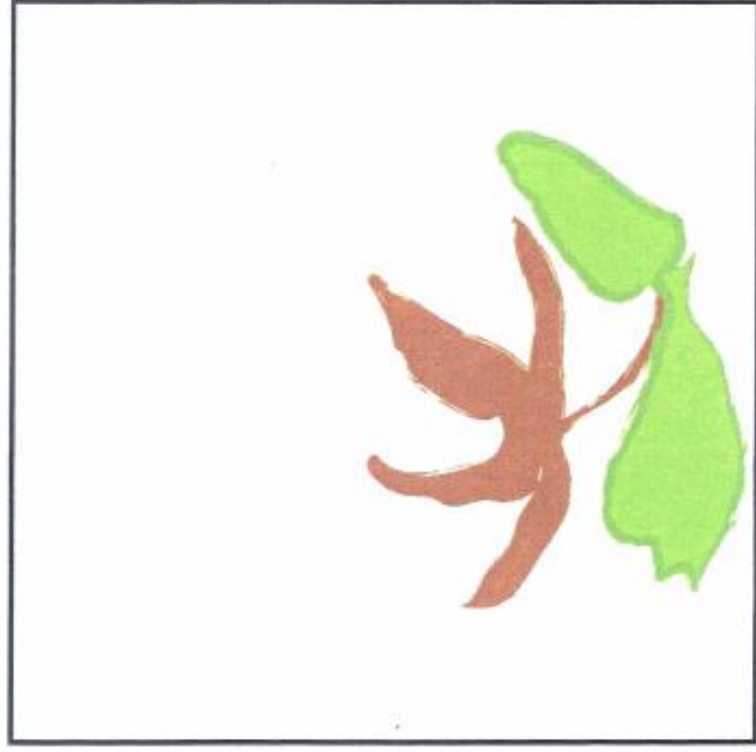
On Friday he ate FIVE Houston County PEANUTS.

But, he was still hungry.

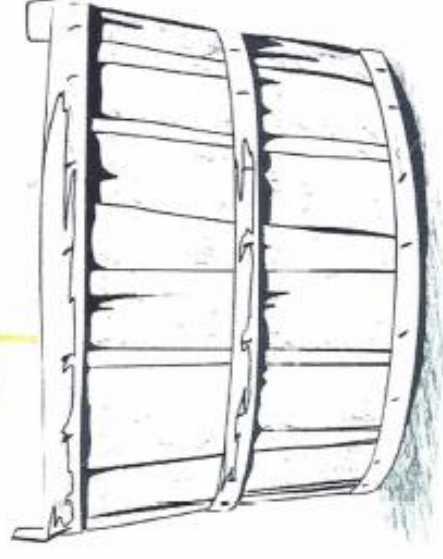

That night, he had a STOMACHACHE!

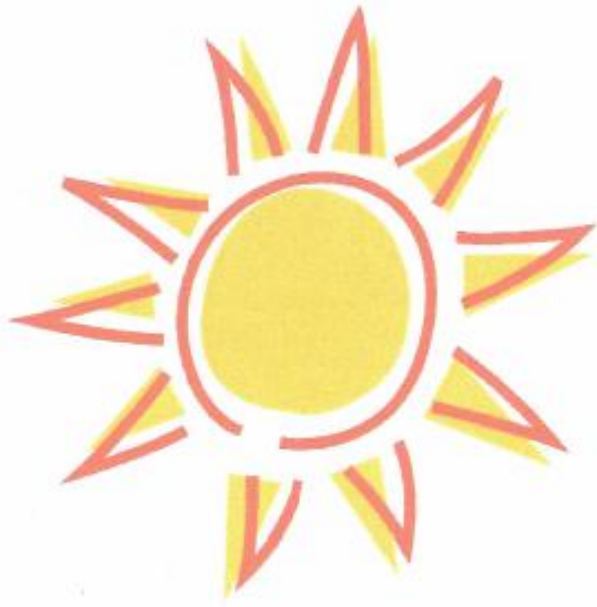
Now he wasn't hungry anymore – and he
